Marquette staff values strong relationships with students and their families. We work to build an alliance with students and their families focused on achieving high academic and social emotional expectations for all students. As a team, we continually strive for our own improvement through professional development, reflection, and innovation.

Progress

Marquette teachers embraced the use of the 5 step reading process as a framework for planning and teaching reading. The focus was teaching reading behaviors to support students' ability to read and comprehend complex text (R10) through shared reading instruction. We also held a Community Read and worked with Lapham to start an African American Family Empowerment Group. We focused on building stronger universal systems to support students' social emotional and behavioral development.

Area for Growth

Our work this past year on the 5 step reading process was technical. This upcoming year we need to work on reflecting and revising on our lessons to be more culturally responsive and increase student ownership. We will develop a shared purpose and increase involvement in the African American Parent Empowerment Group. Our culture and climate focus will be to develop strong peer relationships and problem solving skills among the students.

Vision Connection

Our school supports MMSD's vision that all students acquire the skills and abilities needed to be successful, including a mastery of content areas, growth mindset, self-knowledge, creativity, wellness, interpersonal skills, confidence, cultural competence, and community connection. 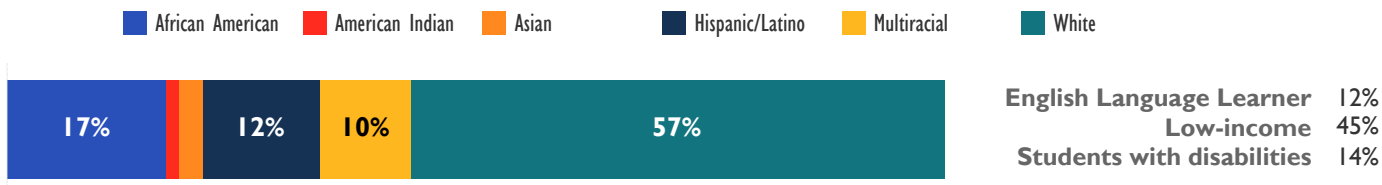

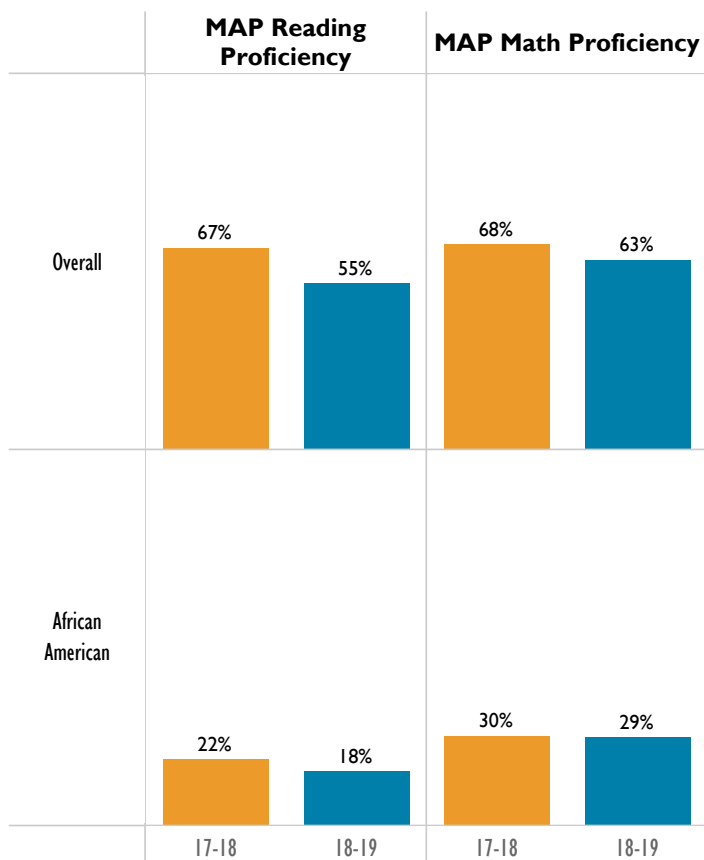


Strategic Framework Goal #1 Milestones: On-Track to Graduate
